

DISCUSSION TOPICS

February is Black History month.

The story of Violet Desmond tells of a time when black people experienced racially prejudiced laws in Canada. The story about the re-naming of geographic areas in Quebec using the word "nigger" shows that we still have issues to examine to reduce racism in Canada. Other groups of people also experience prejudice. Ask your learners to talk about this idea.

- 1. What other groups of people experience prejudice in Canada?
- 2. How does the use of words like "nigger" and "squaw" cause hurt?

PLAN FOR FAMILY DAY

- Identify events planned in your community
- Find family-friendly places they can go for a picnic or activity like skating or skiing
- 3. Locate these on a map
- 4. Discover transportation options to get to these events or places
- 5. Identify the members of their families
- 6. Talk about what to do for those who don't have family nearby

Draw a large bank "cheque" on the board. Fill it in and sign it. Now draw another cheque and ask students to come up and fill it in. Give them different amounts to complete.

Ask learners if they have ideas to share about reducing their electric bill.








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
