Robots can do human jobs (WCR4)

Machine learning, artificial intelligence and robotics have changed how people live and work in many ways. Some people think that robots are making the world a better place. Others are worried they will replace human workers.

Split your class into two groups. One group is in favour of robots and the other is against them. Give each group time to research supporting points for their perspective.

When time is up, split the group up into pairs where each pair has one member supporting and one member opposing. Let learner pairs share their own points.

Finally, ask learners whether they have changed their mind after listening to their partner.
