Why? When Jones walked across the island to teach children of all races, he faced dangers such as beatings and cougars. His story inspired generations of Black British Columbians.


How? Parents fought with the government to pay Jones. They won in 1869.

Earthquake preparedness (WCR1)

There is an <u>Earthquake preparedness teaching</u> <u>kit</u> for Canadian Language Benchmarks (CLB) Levels 4-5 in the <u>Decoda Library</u>.

The purpose of this kit is to help learners prepare themselves, their families, and their homes in case of an earthquake. In addition to four core lessons that are each 1.5 hours long, there are 4 follow-up activities. The teacher's manual is accompanied by teaching aids, including an emergency preparedness kit.




