Make your own heart

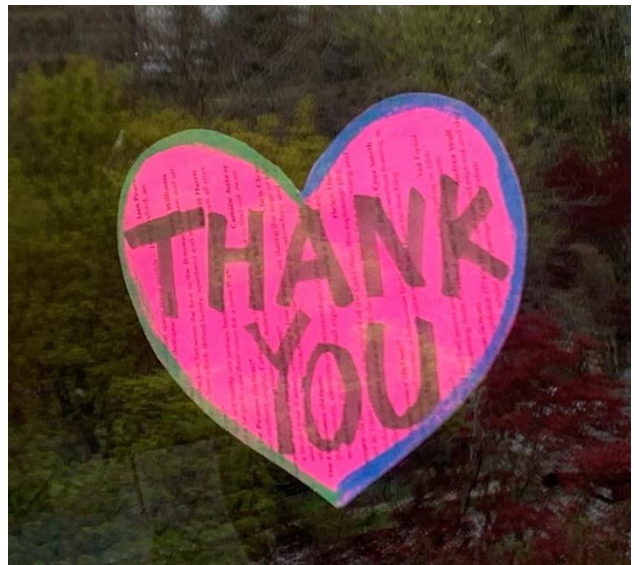
Making a heart for your window is easy.

3. Cut out the heart.
4. Open the heart.
5. Write a message.
6. Tape the heart on your window.
