How many ways to vote are listed in "How to vote in BC"? Answer: 4

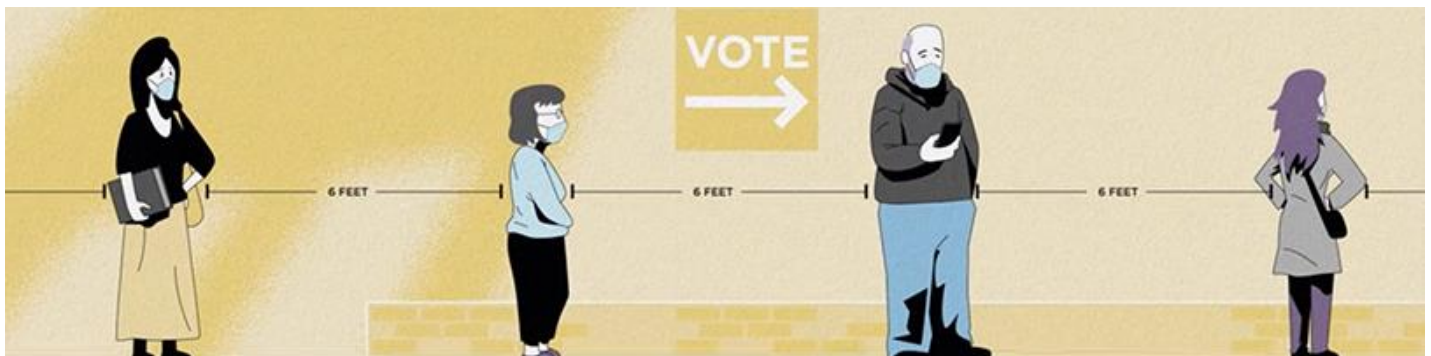
